


## Review of the agreed syllabus



As many of you will be aware, we review our Locally Agreed Syllabus every five years. To take account of the impact of Covid-19, we have extended the current syllabus by a year and the new syllabus will start from **Sept 2023**.

- The review will begin in the Summer Term of 2021 with a questionnaire
- In Autumn 2021 we will run focus groups, more than likely held remotely.
- We will be looking for interested teachers to contribute to the whole process of developing the new syllabus, which will take on board the many significant developments in RE over the last three years.

REQM is a highly prized validation of quality RE in a school and ranges from Bronze – Silver – Gold.


